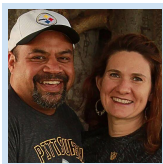


Jo‘el Williams

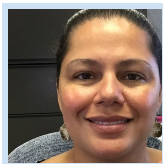

Kim & Koa Lum

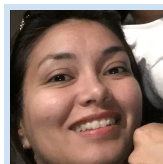

Clydette Self

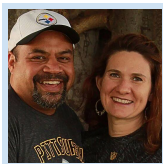

Sophomore Year



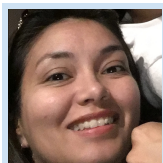
Sascha Baron

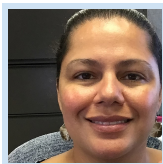
Kau'i Kane
